INSTRUCTION

Educational Research

The board recognizes the importance of research as a means of improving the instructional program for the district's students and also recognizes the need to monitor and control the amount of time and resources expended by both staff and students on research projects. Agencies or individuals desiring to conduct research involving students, student records, student data or staff members must submit a written proposal to the curriculum and assessment department for review and approval prior to initiation of the study. All research proposals must demonstrate that the projected findings will have value to either the district as a whole or to a unit within the district and not be unduly disruptive or time consuming to the educational process. Agencies or individuals authorized to conduct research in the district will hold the district harmless from any and all claims occurring out of the authorized project.
