
They first met last month to begin developing recommended changes to elementary school boundaries. The changes are needed for the fall, 2019 opening of new elementary no. 18 in the southern region of the district.

The group's recommendations should be finished by the end of May 2018. By October 2018, the board will approve new boundaries. Families impacted by the change will have 11 months to become familiar with their changed school boundaries and the different schools students will attend starting fall, 2019.

The 2016 capital bond and levy funded 10 portable classrooms for elementary and middle school growth, and 14 portable classrooms for high school growth. Costs include furniture and equipment, classroom technology, security systems, ramps, stairs, raised walkways, and utility connections.

A series of meetings have been scheduled with key departments to determine the portables needs for the 2018-2019 school year. Two portables have been ordered for Silver Lake Elementary and one for Monroe Elementary and should be installed this spring.

In 2016, voters approved a Capital Bond which included the district's eighteenth elementary school north of 180th St. SE, east of Sunset Road and south of 174th St. SE. The two-story school of 78,000 feet will have 28 classrooms for 550 students from kindergarten through fifth grade.



There were permitting delays because of the City of Everett's interpretation of the Department of Ecology's new water quality treatment requirements and more recently, our contractor inadvertently made an error on their bond documents that must be corrected before they can proceed with the project.

Cascade Football Coach Shane Keck, administration and facilities staff are working together to come up with the best solution for fall practices. Currently the plan involves the football team primarily practicing on the baseball outfield with temporary goal posts (we used this plan a few years ago when we installed the track). Ultimately, while the delay is unfortunate, the installation of turf will be a major boon for Cascade High for years to come.
