RESOLUTION NO. 128

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Directors of Everett School District No. 2, Snohomish County, Washington, providing for the submission of a proposition to the qualified electors of the District at a special election to be held therein on February 8, 1966, authorizing the levy of an excess tax of approximately \$1,950,000.00, for the general fund to provide the sum of \$1,950,000.00 for the purpose of repairing, improving and rehabilitating existing school buildings, facilities and equipment, providing school supplies, and the maintenance of salaries to attract competent personnel,

WHEREAS, many of the existing school buildings and equipment therein need extensive repairs, improvements and rehabilitating, and

WHEREAS, the funds available for such purposes are hopelessly inadequate and it is therefore necessary to provide additional funds for such school purposes, and

WHEREAS, the funds on hand are insufficient to pay and attract competent competent school personnel, and to improve, repair and rehabilitate existing school buildings and equipment and to purchase the necessary additional supplies, and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost of the repairs, improvements and rehabilitation of existing school buildings, facilities and equipment, additional supplies and the maintenance of salaries to keep pace with the increased cost of living and to attract competent personnel, in addition to funds otherwise available for such purpose, is declared to be the sum of \$1,950,000.00,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of Everett School District No. 2 of Snohomish County, Washington, that said additional funds be raised as follows: \$1,950,000.00 by the levy in the year 1966 of a tax of 25 mills without regard to any tax limitations provided by law for the purpose of maintenance, repair, and improvement and rehabilitation of existing school buildings, facilities and equipment, purchase of additional supplies and payment of salaries.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an emergency exists requiring a special election where the voters within said Everett School District

No. 2 may ratify or reject the proposition herein mentioned.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a special election shall be held in Everett School District No. 2, Snohomish County, Washington, on the 8th day of February, 1966, at which there shall be submitted to the qualified voters of said District the following proposition, to-wit:

Whether or not Everett School District No. 2 of Snohomish County, Washington, shall be authorized to levy in the year 1966 a tax of 25 mills without regard to any tax limitations provided by law to secure funds in the estimated amount of \$1,950,000.00 for the purpose of maintaining, improving, repairing and rehabilitating existing school buildings, facilities and equipment and maintaining salary schedules and purchasing additional supplies in addition to funds otherwise available for such purpose.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Auditor of Snohomish County, Washington, as supervisor of elections, be requested to arrange for said election and to select the polling places and election officials for such special election. The polls at such special election shall be open from 8:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of Everett School District No. 2 cooperate in every way with the County Auditor, who is ex-officio supervisor of elections for Snohomish County, Washington.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the proposition submitted by this resolution shall appear on the ballot in substantially the following form:

EXCESS LEVY FOR GENERAL FUND

Shall Everett School District No. 2 be authorized to levy in the year 1966 for the district's General Fund a tax of approximztely 25 mills upon all of the taxable property within Everett School District No. 2, Snohomish County, Washington, in excess of the annual tax levy permitted the school district without a vote of the people, such levy to be made in 1966 for collection in 1967, for the purpose of providing \$1,950,000.00 to pay part of the cost of maintaining, improving, repairing, and rehabilitating existing school buildings, facilities and equipment and the maintenance of employees' salaries and the purchase of additional supplies, all as more
