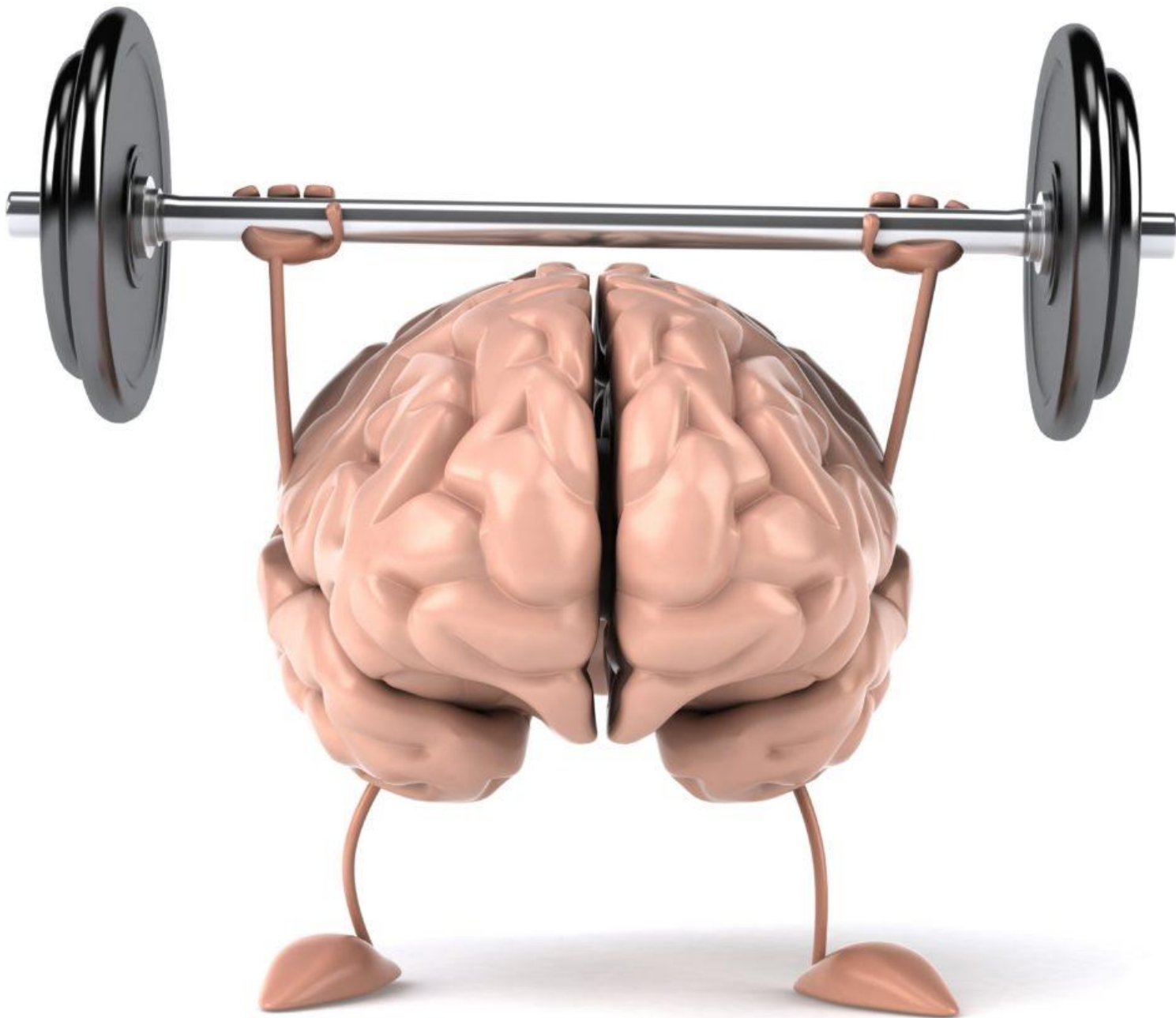

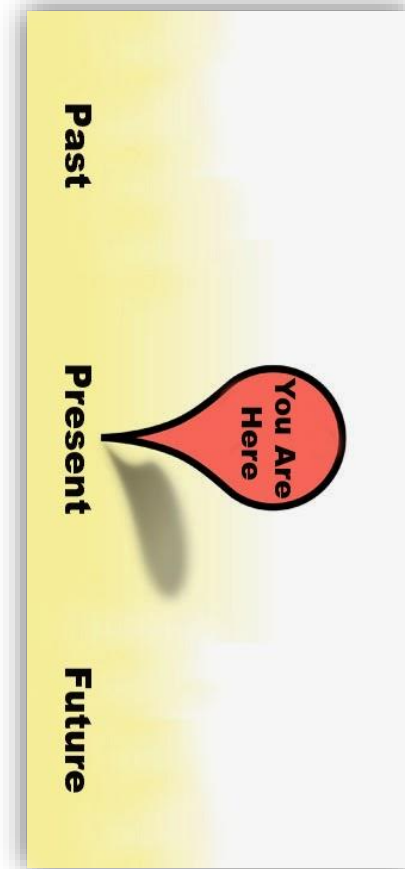

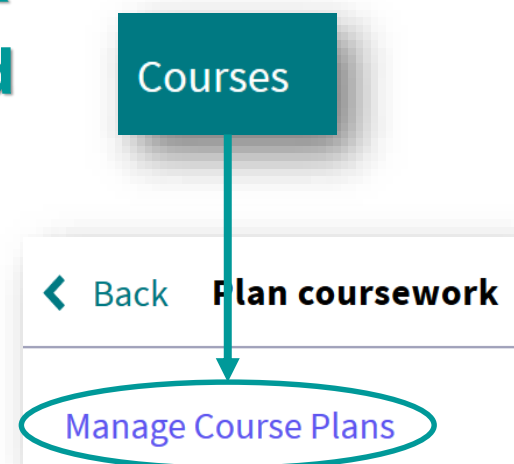

Using Naviance *Student* Course Planner

The **Course Planner**

- Allows you to read a description of each class
- Tells you which grade levels can take the class
- Lists any pre-requisite classes

To begin, click the **Courses > Plan coursework**
Either choose to **Manage Course Plans** or **Add a New Plan**

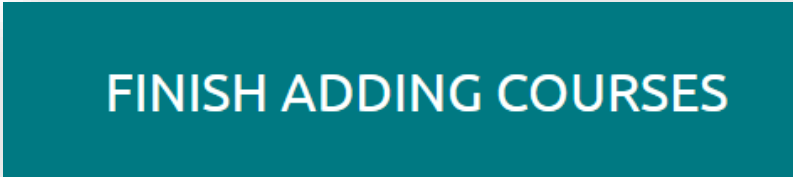

☐ Complete Senior Brag Sheet Survey to be ready to request teacher and counselor recommendations.	About Me > Surveys > Surveys Not Started - The Brag Sheet Survey provides teachers and counselors with specific information needed to write a quality college recommendation letter. - The survey collects all this information in one place, including accomplishments, goals, and future plans.
☐ Contact teachers and staff to request letters of recommendation	- Minimum of 2-weeks ahead of the due date!! - Needed for... - Common App Colleges - Some Coalition Colleges - Some scholarships - NCAA - Add a teacher request by going to the Colleges > Apply to College > Letters of Recommendation - Let them know you filled out the Brag Sheet Survey
☐ Check out Financial Aid options (<i>FAFSA/WASFA apps. Open October 1st</i>)	- Not sure about financial aid and what is available? Colleges > Research Colleges > College Resources - Scroll down to Financial Aid
☐ Request transcripts through Naviance for colleges you are applying to	- For submitted college applications ONLY - You can request additional transcripts for scholarships and/or athletics throughout the year
