#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Participation in girls wrestling continues to increase. A head coach will be in place at Jackson in 2019-2020 giving each comprehensive high school a head girls wrestling coach.
- 2. A large number of girls continue to tryout for volleyball at the middle schools. Due to playing time limitation, up to 30 girls are kept to play on the two teams that are provided. Adding a third volleyball team at each middle school will provide additional opportunities to at least 15 girls per school.
- 3. Schools in the Northshore, Lake Washington, and Bellevue school districts have successfully added girls badminton as a spring sport to increase female participation. Offering this sport in Everett Public Schools may lead to an increase in female athletic participation. In the 2017 Student Interest Survey, 28.6% of the female respondents indicated they would be interested in playing this sport in the spring.
- 4. In spring, 2018 the Washington Interscholastic Activities Association added slow pitch softball as an official fall sport. A state championship tournament will be played in the fall of 2019. Leagues that experimented with the sport in recent years report great success in the increase of female participation.
- 5. The Title IX Interest Survey will be conducted in the fall of 2019. The results of the survey will guide the district in determining if additional sports or teams should be added in the future to increase opportunities for females.
