






# Exploring Post-Secondary Options

<p><b>Are you ready for what comes next?</b></p>	<p>Throughout your senior year, well-meaning people often ask about your plans after high school.</p> <p>This can cause stress and anxiety as you are working to identify options that are the best <b>FIT</b> for you.</p> <p>Your senior year is about the journey and taking time to develop your own plan for the future.</p> <p>There are many post-secondary options available. Looking at multiple options for after graduation and creating a plan A, B, &amp; C, helps you prepare for what comes next.</p>																								
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<p>1. Everett Public Schools is a participating institution in the following <b>guaranteed admissions programs</b>, or GAP:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The <a href="#">Guaranteed Admission Program</a> with Washington four-year, public institutions</li> <li>The <a href="#">Automatic Admission Partnership</a> with Pacific Lutheran University</li> <li>The Guaranteed Admission Program with <a href="#">Saint Martin's University</a></li> </ul> <p style="text-align: center;"> <i>Central Washington University              Eastern Washington University              The Evergreen State College              Pacific Lutheran University              Saint Martin's University              University of Washington Tacoma              Washington State University              Western Washington University</i> </p>	<p><b>To qualify for the Guaranteed Admissions Program, a student must have:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (GPA of 3.3 for Pacific Lutheran University)</li> <li>Completed necessary College Academic Distribution Requirements (CADR) courses in high school (typically mirrors high school grad requirements)</li> <li>Completed the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) Form (which is included in the student handbook, the enrollment form, or annual student information update) and provided permission to share high school student information with colleges.</li> </ul> <p>If all of these are true or the student is on track to meet these criteria by high school graduation, GAP guarantees the student will be admitted to all participating institutions.</p>
<p>2. Log into <b>Naviance</b></p>	<div style="display: flex; align-items: center;">  <div> <p><b>Username: district ID#</b></p> <p><b>Password: district password</b></p> </div> </div>
<p>3. Explore <b>SuperMatch</b> by customizing your search.</p> <p>You can search over 4000 colleges from culinary, technical, 4-year, and military academies.</p> <p>Click <b>Colleges &gt; SuperMatch College Search</b>. Select your search criteria and <b>BEGIN!</b></p> <p>Remember to <b>favorite</b> colleges/programs to return to later.</p>	
<p>4. Explore <b>Military</b> options by clicking on <b>Careers &gt; Explore Military Branches</b>. Click on the links to access each military branch website.</p> <p>Remember to <b>favorite</b> the branch to return to later.</p>	
<p>5. Explore options closer to you! Check out colleges (2-yr./4-yr./tech.), apprenticeships, certificates, etc. right in Washington.</p> <p>Click the <a href="#">website link</a> &gt; <b>Find Education &gt; Education Type</b></p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><a href="https://careerbridge.wa.gov">https://careerbridge.wa.gov</a></p>
