3.3.2 Spells accurately in final draft.

- Uses spelling words and patterns from the previous grades.
- Uses multiple strategies to spell. Examples:
 - homophones (e.g., capital and capitol)
 - affixes (e.g., dis-, ir-, -ist, -ism)
 - Greek and Latin roots (e.g., <u>circus</u>, <u>spiral</u>, <u>vision</u>)
 - words from other languages (e.g., arena, buffet, soufflé, lariat)
 - frequently misspelled words (e.g., accommodation, cemetery, receive)
- Uses resources to correct own spelling.

3.3.3 Applies capitalization rules.

- Uses capitalization rules from previous grades.
- Uses capitals the title of a specific course (e.g., History 9A as opposed to history).
- Uses resources to check capitalization.

3.3.4 Applies punctuation rules.

- Uses punctuation rules from previous grades.
- Uses commas to enclose titles (e.g., Mohammed Abdul, M.D., is a pediatrician.).
- Places commas and periods inside quotation marks.
- Uses apostrophes to form plurals of letters or numbers (e.g., Know your ABC's.).
- Uses colon between title and subtitle (e.g., Write Source 2000: A Guide to Thinking, Writing and Learning).
- Uses diagonal slash (/) correctly:
 - in a fraction
 - to show choice
- Uses resources to check punctuation.



- 3.3.5 Applies usage rules.
 - Applies usage rules from previous grades.
 - Identifies and corrects past grammar and usage issues.
 - Uses fewer vs. less correctly.
 - Uses parallel construction when listing infinitive phrases.
 - parallel: Jamillah likes to hike, swim, and ride a bicycle.
 - not parallel: Jamillah likes to hike, to swim, and rides a bicycle.
 - Uses resources to check usage.
- 3.3.6 Uses complete sentences in writing.
 - May use fragments in dialogue as appropriate.
- 3.3.7 Applies paragraph conventions.
 - Uses paragraph conventions (e.g., designate by indentation or block format, skipping lines between paragraphs).
 - Uses textual markers (e.g., rows, columns, and tables).
- 3.3.8 Applies conventional forms for citations.
 - Cites sources according to prescribed format (e.g., MLA, APA).
