The studio is just yards south of the ferry dock in Edmonds with a remarkable view. Eric's business will provide portraits for families and businesses. This adds to the BundlePix brand that serves local school athletic teams. In addition to team and individual shots, Eric's company shoots at least one event for every team, providing actions shots sold to family members of the athletes.
