Learning Target

The student will describe strategies for interacting collaboratively with all children and adults.

Self-Reflection

Self-Reflection and knowing who you are is a good starting point for working collaboratively with families.

Things to reflect on

- How are you unique?
- How have you grown to be who you are?
- What do you value?
- What are your perspectives on children and their families?

Development of Identity

- Children will watch every move you make.
- Children learn through what they are deliberately taught and by observing.
- Cultural patterns and expectations are demonstrated and "taught" to the child through modeled behavior they observe from the adults in their lives.

Make sure every child sees themselves reflected in class activities

- Support each child's sense of self and family
- Engage children in the acceptance and appreciation of differences and similarities in people, and
- Help children better understand beliefs and customs different from their own

Having a multi-cultural non-biase environment

- Do not have posters or other visuals/books that have a stereotype image
- Use different types of learning materials that help children feel comfortable with their identity as well as increase awareness of other people

Learning Materials to use

• Reflect diversity in books, magazines, dolls, puzzles, paintings, music, and block area props, etc.
